SECTION 2 - HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Colorless combustible liquid, potentially hazardous vapors. Can cause serious or fatal complications if swallowed. Can cause eye and skin irritation upon contact. SECTION 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES
